**Request from the Education Committee to the Finance Committee:
To increase the Biennium 2010-2012 Allocation at \$60K or at least maintain it
at \$50K**

By reference to the Expenditure listed in the Spreadsheet it can be seen that all but \$1200 of the \$50K was spent (or committed) in the 2008-2010 biennium.

The Educational programmes supported and amounts allocated were:

- **6th Asia Pacific IAP Meeting, Cochi, Kerala , August, 2009** \$5000
- **AWAD IAP 3rd Scientific Meeting , Ibadan, Nigeria, Aug. 2009** \$5000
- **EAD IAP 1st Inaugural Meeting Nairobi, Kenya, August 2009** \$5000
- **Argentinian Division Meetings, Buenos Areis Oct./ Nov. 2009** \$5000
- **Arab Division, 23rd ADIAP Congress, Cairo, December 2010** \$5000
- **Swiss Division, Workshop in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, 2010** \$3800
- **Romanian Division 1st Scientific Meeting Cluj, April 2010** \$5000
- **Cuban Division 2nd Scientific Congress Havana March 2011** \$5000
- **Ukraine Division Scientific Meeting Kharkiv May, 2010** \$5000
- **Taiwan Division, 7th Asia Pacific IAP Congress, Taipei 2011** \$5000

**Thus we have to date spent/committed \$48,800 leaving only \$1,200 until the
next allocation**

BIENNIUM 2008-2010

I foresee that there will be requests coming in for support from the other deserving Divisions/ Countries and to which I have added the amount of support predicted, bearing in mind also the increase in travel costs and in holding meetings

Foremost amongst global areas are:

Latin American Countries	\$10000
Africa, East and West and central	\$10000

Followed by:

Eastern Europe; former USSR countries	\$10000
Asia Pacific Countries	\$10000

Other worthy requests not yet considered	\$10000 +
Funding for IAP 2012 Congress Bursaries*	\$5000

Thus, with a total predicted/planned spend of \$60.000 in the next two years on behalf of the Education Committee I request that for the 2010-2012 Biennium the allocation is increased to \$60K (\$50 K + an additional \$10K)

While I realize that the current economic climate is not the most auspicious of times to request more money, I do hope this request from the Education Committee for \$60K will be favourably considered especially since \$28,648 representing a half share of the profits of the 2008 Athens Congress has been donated by the Hellenic Division and specifically designated for **“education activities of the underserved countries”**
